




Remember to measure out your ingredients carefully.

- 2 cups of flour
- 1/2 cup of salt
- 2 tablespoons of cream of tartar
- 2 tablespoons of oil or baby lotion
- I cup of hot water
- Combine the dry ingredients in a bowl, add the oil or baby lotion and then the water.

You could also add some food colouring here if you would like a colourful




