Social media

Can I ask that families follow the correct processes to express concerns and refrain from posting on social media? The school do not see posts on closed sites (such as Lipson Vale Primary Mums and Dads) unless they are passed to us and we cannot, therefore, resolve situations until we are made aware. Please use these closed sites for support and guidance but raise any difficulties directly with us.

Relationships Policy

I mentioned on the last NFTV about our new policy, which replaces the previous behaviour policy. This is an exciting new policy for us and follows significant training for all staff throughout the last academic year. The training focused on being 'Trauma Informed', which is a Plymouth aspiration for all schools, and focuses on the importance of developing secure relationships and sustaining a positive learning environment through compassion and curiosity. The policy is available on our website here. Your child may have come home talking about our READY behaviours and/or the Window of Tolerance - all will make sense by having a read through. I hope to share more information with you in the coming weeks, as we develop school practice and systems in line with this policy.






This week, Year 4 learned about the human digestive system by enjoying a fun (and messy!) experiment in which Mr Petty
