Consider safety in different environments, such as road safety and relate this to risk and safety at home as well as accidents and emergencies, including how to get help and from who.

Learn how to identify risks and hazards, including how to predict, manage and assess risk and consider aspects of safety/ rules in the local environment and unfamiliar places.
